Postal Rates During the Gold Yuan Era: The Chinese Hyperinflation of 1948-49

This is a postal history exhibit that looks to postal rates to illustrate the hyperinflation that took place in China during the Gold Yuan era, the period between October 1948 and early June 1949 during which stamps denominated in Gold Yuan currency (GY) were in use.

The order of presentation in the exhibit is chronological within the following categories:

Surface Rates — Domestic — Fourteen Rate Periods (DS1 to 9, 10a to e)

International — Eighteen Rate Periods (IS1 to 13, 14a to e)

Airmail Rates — Domestic — Twenty-five Rate Periods (DA1 to 20, 21a to e)

International — Eighteen Rate Periods (IA1 to 13, 14a to e)

In late April 1949, a new currency denominated in silver dollar coins (Silver Yuan or SY) was introduced to replace GY. Rate Periods DS10a-e, IS14a-e, DA21a-e and IA14a-e reflect only those postal rates computed at the exchange rate officially announced in Shanghai from time to time between GY and SY. Exchange rates in other cities and towns were not set by central postal authorities and can only be determined empirically.

The context in which these rates evolved can be summarized as follows:

- Aug. 20, 1948 GY introduced to replace Chinese National Currency (CNC) in circulation since 1937. Intended to reform China's monetary system and stabilize prices. Exchangeable for CNC at a rate of CNC \$3,000,000 to GY \$1.
- Oct. 9, 1948 First stamps denominated in GY issued. Inflation again beginning to take hold.
- Jan. 31, 1949 Stamps denominated in CNC demonetized.
- Jan.-Apr. 1949 Nationalist fortunes continue to decline. Value of GY continues to erode.
- Late Apr. 1949 SY introduced to replace GY.
- May 1949 GY remains valid in many areas but value continues to erode through an accelerating decline in the GY:SY exchange rate (variable from place to place).
- May 27, 1949 Shanghai falls to Communist forces.
- June 1949 Use of GY effectively ends.

"Percentage increase from prior period" and "Percentage increase from introduction of GY" compare ordinary mail rates for the first 20g and the sum of ordinary mail rates and airmail surcharges for the first 20g (domestic) or 10g (international), as applicable.

Because many Chinese cancels number the year from 1912, the year of the founding of the Republic, 1948 is usually referred to as 37, and 1949 as 38. Unless specified otherwise, dollar amounts are expressed in GY. Chinese names and terms are Romanized using the *pin yin* system.








Value declared mail was a form of domestic insured mail that was introduced in early 1947. Contents were originally restricted to valuable documents and vouchers such as legal papers, deeds of title, money orders, bank checks and the like. The mailing of currency was permitted beginning January 6, 1949. The value declared fee was in addition to postage and registration, which was required, but other ancillary services such as airmail, express, or Acknowledgment of Receipt were optional.

By the time the cover was delivered on May 24, the exchange rate had again increased, this time to \$30,000,000:\$1. Unique.



DOMESTIC SURFACE—EPILOGUE

Rate Periods DS10a - 10e reflect the GY equivalents of the silver dollar coin (SY) rates introduced in late April, 1949 computed at the then current rate of exchange in Shanghai. Most domestic surface rate covers mailed from Shanghai between May 20 and 27 (Rate Periods 10c, 10d, and 10e) were local uses as, by then, Communist forces controlled all land and water routes into and out of the city.

Because of ever-increasing GY:SY exchange rates, the higher values of the set of stamps locally surcharged in Fuzhou by the Fujian Postal District in late April (the \$100,000 value of which is shown below) were some of the few GY stamps that remained useful into late May and early June. On cover uses of the Fuzhou surcharges are very

scarce.

INTERNATIONAL SURFACE—EPILOGUE

While GY stamps continued to be used throughout May and into early June in many cities and towns remaining under Nationalist control, the rates of exchange between GY and SY varied from place to place and from day to day. As a result, in areas outside Shanghai, postal rates computed in GY can only be determined empirically by examination of mailed covers and not by reference to official postal and exchange rate tables.

DOMESTIC AIRMAIL—EPILOGUE

For all practical purposes, the fall of Shanghai on May 27, 1949 marked the end of the GY era. Some post offices continued to accept GY stamps to pay SY postal rates, but exchange rates were rising exponentially. Before long, the weight of the GY stamps used to frank letters exceeded the weight of the letters themselves, and stocks of usable high-value stamps (lower value stamps being wholly impractical) were quickly exhausted.


Although this cover was mailed on May 24, 1949, the first day of Rate Period IA14e, the SY 10¢ portion of the postage that was paid in GY was accepted at the \$12,000,000:\$1 rate in effect during Rate Period IA14d (May 22-23). This item was mailed at about 11:00 a.m. and was one of the last international mail items to leave Shanghai while it was under Nationalist control. By the evening of May 24, both airports in Shanghai had fallen to Communist forces.

INTERNATIONAL AIRMAIL—EPILOGUE

Following the fall of Shanghai, the only GY stamps that remained practical for use were those with values of \$100,000 or more. Aside from several stamps issued in Hankou and Fuzhou for local use, only 4 GY stamps had values that large. The relative stability of the SY postal rates that took effect in late April reflected a retreat from a cash-based economy in the rapidly contracting areas under Nationalist control, not a slowing of the rate of inflation.
